One of the few 12th C. examples of Braies. There doesn't appear to be a roll, but instead a thick sash tying the braies on. The knot shows as a bump in many of the pictures of tunics elsewhere in the bible. Note the angular drape of legs and baggy crotch which are similar in 13th C. versions.

Here you see the braies at the crotch. Very drapery and full. Presumably tucked into chausses.
